

BEGINNER-FRIENDLY PORTFOLIO PROJECTS TO JUMPSTART YOUR DESIGN JOURNEY

Introduction

Want to start a portfolio but don't know where to begin? Building one can feel overwhelming—but it doesn't have to be. These 5 beginner-friendly projects are simple, fun, and perfect for showing off your skills and potential. Start your portfolio today!

Project 1: Design a Poster for A Favourite Movie

Objective: Reimagine the promotional poster for a favourite movie, focusing on creative typography and visuals.

What You Need:

- Paper and markers/pens OR digital tools like Canva or Adobe Express
- A reference image of the movie

Step-by-Step:

- 1. Choose a movie you love.
- 2. Brainstorm 3 key elements that represent the movie (e.g., colors, themes, objects).
- 3. Sketch a rough layout of the poster.
- 4. Finalize the design, adding creative touches like custom fonts or hand-drawn illustrations.

Portfolio Tip: Include a short description explaining why you chose those design elements.



Project 2: Create a Mood Board Inspired by a Color Palette

Objective: Develop a mood board that conveys a specific emotion or theme using a chosen color palette.

What You Need:

- Magazines, printouts, or Pinterest
- A blank sheet of paper or Canva for digital boards

Step-by-Step:

- 1. Pick an emotion (e.g., calm, excitement, nostalgia).
- 2. Choose 3-5 colors that represent this emotion.
- 3. Find images, textures, and patterns that match the theme.
- 4. Arrange and assemble the pieces into a visually cohesive board.

Portfolio Tip: Take a photo or screenshot of the final mood board and explain the chosen theme.

Project 3: Sketch a Redesigned Logo for a Brand You Love

Objective: Reimagine the logo of a favourite brand to give it a fresh, personal twist.

What You Need:

- Paper and pencil OR a drawing tablet
- An example of the original logo

Step-by-Step:

- 1. Analyse the current logo and list its key features (e.g., colors, fonts, shapes).
- 2. Brainstorm ways to simplify or modernize it.
- 3. Create 2-3 rough sketches of new logo ideas.
- 4. Finalize one design and refine the details.

Portfolio Tip: Show the original logo side-by-side with their redesign and write a short paragraph about the changes you made.



Project 4: Develop a Simple App Mock-up

Objective: Create a visual prototype for a fun or useful app idea.

What You Need:

- Free tools like Figma or Canva
- Paper and pens for sketching (optional)

Step-by-Step:

- 1. Think of an app idea (e.g., a daily habit tracker, a recipe-sharing app).
- 2. Sketch the main screen on paper or directly in Figma/Canva.
- 3. Add key features like buttons, menus, or icons.
- 4. Use colors and typography to make the design visually appealing.

Portfolio Tip: Include screenshots of the app mock-up with a brief description of its purpose.

Project 5: Craft a Storyboard for a Short Animation or Game

Objective: Plan out a sequence of frames for a simple animation or game storyline.

What You Need:

- Paper and pens OR digital drawing tools
- A storyline or game idea

Step-by-Step:

- 1. Write down a short storyline (e.g., a character's journey or a game guest).
- 2. Sketch 4-6 frames showing key moments.
- 3. Add notes under each frame to explain what's happening.
- 4. Focus on clear visuals and storytelling.

Portfolio Tip: Present the storyboard as a complete sequence with captions for clarity.

Tips for Presentation

- **Keep It Clean**: Arrange each project on a separate portfolio page, ensuring there's plenty of white space for a professional look.
- Explain Your Work: For each project, include a short description of the process and what you learned.
- Use High-Quality Images: Photograph physical work in good lighting or export digital projects in high resolution.
